Paul Hinckley, candidate for First Selectman, and George Hale, candidate for Board of Selectmen, will outline and briefly discuss their Platform Issues at 10:00 am in front of the Woodbury Town Offices on Thursday, May 10th. The Platform Issues are based on their experiences in serving the Town and will be used as discussion points with the Woodbury voters in their campaign to the November 6th Elections. These issues are based on Paul's past 20 years of Town management experiences on the Board of Selectmen, the Board of Finance, and the Region 14 Board of Education AND George's Town management experiences on the Planning Commission, the Board of Assessment Appeals, coaching for the Park & Recreation Department, and servicing many areas with his landscaping business. It is

anticipated that these issues will be clarified and expanded as they gain insights from Woodbury citizens.

In the coming months they will issue Platform Issue papers detailing the issues, their experiences, recommendations, and implementation plans to address each issue.

- **Resource and Scenic Vista Preservation**
Conserve our vital natural resources including aquifer, rivers, ridgelines, and key open space.
- **Balanced Planning of Town's Capital Needs**
Implement well-designed plans that balance Town needs with taxpayers' ability to finance.
- **Empower Volunteers through Education**
Support all-inclusive volunteers on boards and commissions through training and sharing.
- **Recreation Opportunities for Teenagers**
- **Environmental Accountability**
Encourage individual and municipal actions to protect our environment.
